

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever. *(entrance antithon for the people)*

(entrance antiphon for the 25th week of Ordinary Time)

I've got a bit of a confession I'd like to make to you: I *love* doing my taxes each year! I am fascinated and delighted by the process of figuring out the various aspects of the tax year and how it is properly reported to the IRS.

Weird, right? Admittedly, part of the fun is seeing how I can best utilize the options available to me so as to get the best possible refund... or at least minimize tax liabilities! I've learned a lot over the years - clergy taxes are a special kind of complicated - but its a fun once-a-year hobby, albeit often quite involved.



The reason I share this is prompted by the Gospel reading for today. Errors notwithstanding, I don't try to cheat the federal

government of any money - but Jesus' parable of the steward reminds me of how many hours I spend on a relatively modest tax return.

It prompts me to consider how much time I spend on things that truly matter - things that last for eternity. Jesus is inviting you and I to reflect on if and how we might value earthly treasures over those things that are eternal.

If someone audited not just my financials, but all of the time and efforts I spent throughout my life, what would stand out as the highest priority of my life? Happily - as with the steward of today's parable - it is not too late for us to re-evaluate and, where necessary, change. May we put Jesus first, now and always.

September 21 is the **feast** of Saint Matthew, apostle and evangelist. At the top of the reredos in our church, you'll notice the four icons of the Gospel writers - Saint Matthew's is of an angel.



All four of these symbols come from the book of Revelation. The angel (or winged man) is a representation of Jesus' incarnation - the story of which is most fully laid out in the Gospel of Matthew.

Once a tax collector, <u>Saint Matthew is an</u> example of how God calls sinners to join in <u>His work on earth</u>. May we respond as he did!

This week and in the coming weeks, I would like to introduce you to what will be our 2023 pew missals: the Source & Summit missal. Due to our budgetary constraints, this would have been out of our reach. However, through the generosity of an anonymous donor, we are able to purchase a subscription to this missal for the next two liturgical years!

That said, this will only be useful if we know how to use it. We don't yet have them here,

but the **entire book** is available for review online. Check it out at the link above. May we take this opportunity to more fully enter into the Mass.
