Princess Angeline meeting





WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

All that you have done to us, O Lord, you have done with true judgment, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy.

Cf. Dn 3: 31, 29, 30, 43, 42

You may have noticed that every week I include a scripture verse with this insert. This is the **entrance antiphon** for the Sunday Mass.

'Antiphon', comes from the Latin *antiphonos*, meaning 'responsive, sounding in answer'. If that sounds familiar, that's because we do this at every Mass in the Responsorial Psalm. Those who pray the Liturgy of the Hours - especially in community - will also recognize this pattern of call and response in prayer.



The praying of the psalms is something that is integral to the Mass. So integral, in fact, that the Church has spoken of the removal of antiphons as cheating the people of crucial parts of the Mass.

You'll have noticed that we are currently singing very limited portions of the antiphons - this is because Greg Teeter (our music director) and I decided to limit ourselves to what we currently have available - and the Saint Michael hymnal abbreviates the antiphons.

Happily, we will soon (November 27th) have a new pew missal - with the full text of the antiphons. Over the coming weeks, we will be offering exploring how we can more fully pray the Mass in the singing of the antiphons. In the meantime, I heartily recommend this article (and it's footnotes!) on antiphony & the Mass.
