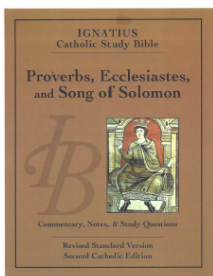

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.

Cf. Ps 17 (16): 6, 8

In the United States, there is a pride that exists in the idea ‘pulling oneself up by one’s bootstraps’. Especially when looking at great success stories, the myth of succeeding by one’s own merits or efforts is a powerful one.

It’s also demonstrably untrue! There is not a single person who has accomplished anything without the help of another. Even Jesus - Who certainly *could* have worked solo - depended on the help of others: first His parents, later those who followed Him, especially the Apostles.



In today’s first reading, Moses, too, must rely on Aaron and Hur to hold his arms up in supplication to the Lord - for as long as his hands raised, Israel had the better of the fight. So it was that Israel, relied on God - through Moses, who himself relied on Aaron and Hur - to ensure victory.

The month of October is **Respect Life Month**. Each of us can probably name at least a couple of people upon whom we have relied, without whom we might not be here today - our parents, guardians, family, and friends. And they undoubtedly relied on others even as they supported us!

How will we hold up those who now need our support - most especially the mothers and fathers who find themselves struggling? May we look for opportunities to support them!

This Tuesday, October 18th, is **the feast day of Saint Luke**.

This is a particularly special day for our sister parish here in Shoreline - not only because it is their patron feast day, but because this is the day that their new altar will be dedicated by Archbishop Etienne as they celebrate the completion of the renovation of their church!
