

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and his strength; constantly seek his face.

Cf. Ps 105 (104): 3-4

Last week's Sunday Gospel ended with a stark question from the Lord "But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" Today's Gospel picks up where we left off, with Jesus offering an unexpected example of faith - the repentence of a tax collector.

Contrasted with him is the false humility offered by the Pharisee who is only willing to



compare himself to others. And although he speaks only the truth - he's *not* like the tax collector - the difference has nothing to do with his success with the precepts of the law.

The difference between them is that the tax collector is compares himself to God - and so sees how he has sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. That recognition elicits the humility and faith that the tax collector lacks.

Putting our faith in God requires that we give ourselves to Him - even the parts of which we're not proud, that cause us shame. "I confess to almighty God, and to you brothers and sisters..." - we say these words at every Mass. The key to faith is to be able to follow it up: what do I need to confess - and have I confessed those things honestly & completely? As the tax collector did, so may we do also.

October 28 is the feast of Saints Simon and Jude. Sadly, record of their lives is mostly lost to history. From scriptures, we know



that Simon was a Zealot (a Jewish movement opposed to the Roman government) and Jude is probably most famous for his question to Jesus at the Last Supper: "Master, [then] what happened that you will reveal yourself to us and not to the world?" (John 14:22) and his letter to the Churches of the East (the penultimate book of the Bible).

Saints Simon and Jude, pray for us!

What is the 40 Hours Devotion? Unlike perpetual adoration, which isn't always feasible, this 16th century devotion is adoration split across multiple days such that it adds up to forty hours. You can read more about this devotion online.

What might this look like at Saint Mark parish - how might we make Eucharistic adoration once again a part of our practice of the faith?
