



🖌 JMJ 🕂 WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honor. To him belong glory and power for ever and ever. Cf. Rev. 5:12, 1:6

Today we celebrate the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. As we come to the end of the liturgical year, we look to our ultimate end and the return of our king.

Did you notice the Gospel reading that the Church chose for today? Perhaps the only obviously regal reference was this line: "Above him there was an inscription that read, 'This is the King of the Jews." Betrayed & abandoned



by his friends, condemned & tortured, and dying on a cross under a sign meant to mock Him.

Who could call that glory?

While that's where we started this Gospel, it is the *ending* that

shows Christ's sovereignty: "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Despite the misery of His circumstances, Jesus accomplishes universally and personally exactly what He came to do: the salvation of man.

Jesus is the source of our salvation - but there is still one thing lacking: our openness to His grace. May we make the words of the good thief our own. "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

Monday, November 21 is the memorial of the **Presentation** of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Tradition holds



that the parents of the Blessed Virgin -Joachim & Anne - presented Mary at the Temple to consecrate her to the Lord in thanksgiving for her birth.

This celebration was first documented by the Byzantine Catholic Church in the 11th century before being adopted by the Roman Catholic Church in the 16th century.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!

Today we begin four weeks of Eucharistic processions at Saint Mark parish. Immediately after the 10:30 am Mass each Sunday, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed in a monstrance and we will have a brief procession. In good weather, we'll go outside

along the perimeter of Saint Mark - otherwise we will process around the perimeter of the church.

This an opportunity to worship the Lord in praise & adoration - consider joining us one (or each!) Sunday inside Seville Catedral as we pray together.
