




WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame.

Cf. Ps 25 (24): 1-3



Today is the **first Sunday of Advent** - today we enter into four weeks of preparation before celebrating the solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord and the season of Christmas.

Traditionally, Advent had similar penitential



practices to the season of Lent, requiring fasting on Fridays of Advent.
Our brethren in the Orthodox Churches

have what they call the 'Nativity Fast', which started about a two weeks ago (November 15).

Though not required to fast, this season nonetheless calls us to greater conversion. The violet vestments remind us of Christ's royalty and our need for repentance. The incrementally lit candles invite us to consider the strength of the flame of faith in our lives. The absence of the *gloria* at Mass refocuses us from present joys to that of the Lord's coming.

We pray today for 'the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming'. Our resolve may yet be lacking and our deeds insufficient - but that's what this time is for: to (re)build us in apostolic faith and zeal. May we make the most of this time.

November 30th is the feast of Saint Andrew. An apostle and brother to Saint Peter, he shared with him a great faith in the Lord and a death like them both. Saint Andrew's martyrdom by crucifixion



was carried on a X-shaped cross. Like his brother (who was crucified upside-down), Andrew did not regard himself worthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Christ.

If you'd like to learn more about him, check out this article by Amy Heyd of Franciscan Media: 'Dinnertime with St. Andrew, Fisher of Men'. Saint Andrew - pray for us!

One wonderful way to prepare for celebrating the Nativity of the Lord is the sacrament of reconciliation - especially if it has been a long time. Come experience God's mercy & love!
