Merry Christmas and happy New Year! May this conclusion of the Christmas season and beginning of 2023 bring many graces & joys.

One of the neat things about Christmas is how it is followed by a plethora of celebrataions. There are immediately three feasts in a row, then a little later the feast of the Holy Family, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, the Epiphany (today), and the Baptism of the Lord

enter - at long last! - into Ordinary Time.

Most of us can't keep this level of fervor up for long, but it may be worthwhile to take the opportunity to examine our life of prayer. How will this time change us, draw us closer to Christ and His Church? What a shame it would be if Christmas were to come and go without having effected a lasting change in our lives!

Perhaps this is the year to begin praying the Liturgy of the Hours, to pray before the Blessed Sacrament (available 9am-4pm every weekday), to join in the Monday evening rosary (6:30pm) or something altogether new. May we too, like the magi, come to be with the Lord. The novemdiales ('nine days') is the traditional mourning

## Epiphany house blessing w/ chalk

It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk at the Masses for Epiphany, using the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year.

The home blessing can be done as follows: Use the blessed chalk to write:

## 20+C+M+B+23

above the doorways: 2023 for the year; C, M, B for the 3 Magi – Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar – and for *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, Latin for "May Christ Bless this House."

As you are writing, pray one of the following prayers:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.

#### or

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

or

Lord our God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the keeping of your law. We give thanks to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.
