

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

Be my protector, O God, a mighty stronghold to save me. For you are my rock, my stronghold! Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name.

Cf. Ps 31 (30): 3-4

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets." - Matthew 5:17

As Christians, we rightly proclaim our freedom in the Lord. Liberated from slavery to sin and from fear of the sting of death, we can face both the joys and sorrows of life knowing that Christ is Lord of all. This faith has allowed saints throughout the ages to live lives of radical witness to the Gospel.



There is a temptation, however, to think that Jesus abolished all

Image courtesy of NYC Wanderer laws, giving us license to do whatever we wish. He Himself rebukes this idea. The words of the psalmist also remind us that "Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord!"

In a little over a week, we will enter into the season of Lent - preparing ourselves over forty days for the celebration of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. With these sacred seasons come reminders of obligations each Catholic must fulfill - fasting & abstinence, in particular. But there are other obligations too! Yearly confession, annual reception of communion, daily prayer, and supporting the Church are among the precepts of our faith.

Let us take time in the days before Lent begins to consider how we might more fully fulfill the law of the Lord! "Since the faithful from different countries come together ever more frequently, it is desirable that they know how to sing together at least some parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin, especially the Profession



of Faith and the Lord's Prayer, according to the simpler settings." (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 41)

As part of our effort to more fully celebrate the Mass as the Church intends - especially aware of the diversity of our community - we will be praying the Lord's Prayer in Latin during Lent. Check out this YouTube video to hear it & practice (with text) ahead of time!

We will soon enter the season of Lent with the celebration of **Ash Wednesday** (Feb. 22). It is a day of <u>fasting (18-59)</u> and <u>abstinence (14 & older)</u>. Though *not* a holy day of obligation, we will be offering two Masses - one at 9:30 am and one at 6:30 pm.

Throughout Lent, additional times for confession will also be offered. Every Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, confessions will be heard from 5 pm to 6 pm.

Finally, the Stations of the Cross will be prayed every Friday after the morning Mass and at 6:30 pm. May we each enter fully into Lent!

Q: Who is leading this effort?

- **A:** There are many different groups involved in the research, planning and execution of this strategic pastoral planning effort:
 - Partners in the Gospel Core Team is comprised of co-leads Caitlin Moulding, chief operations officer and Father Gary Lazzeroni, pastor of St. Joseph in Vancouver and 10 other lay leaders.
 - Oversight Committee is a diverse group of lay leaders, priests, a religious sister, a deacon and our superintendent of Catholic Schools.
 - Presbyteral Council is made up of priests elected by each of the 10 deaneries who advise and consult with Archbishop Etienne.
 - Partners Edge is a research consulting firm that has helped other dioceses work through similar planning efforts.
 - Parish family liaisons, who will be hired and trained by the Archdiocese of Seattle, will support parish families in the process of becoming one parish.
 - You we are asking for feedback and input from all employees and Catholics in the Archdiocese of Seattle in Fall 2023. We are also asking for everyone's prayers for this effort.

Q: What is the process?

A: This is a multiyear, consultative process and everyone is invited to participate. In the first phase, the archdiocese will share and request feedback on an initial draft of the parish families with priests and parish leaders, school principals and leadership, archdiocesan employees and all Catholics across the archdiocese in the Fall 2023.

Once all the input has been collected, the Oversight Committee and the Presbyteral Council will finalize the recommendation. Archbishop Etienne will officially promulgate the new parish family structure in early 2024.

In the second phase, parish families will work together over three years to determine how they will best become one parish by 2027. Each parish family will have a liaison assigned to them to help throughout the process.
