A little while ago I came across an online video of a baby who was being shown some cute talking toy. Anyone over the age of 4 or 5 would probably laugh at the thing, but this baby was so overwhelmed by the sound and movement that it just starting bawling!

When confronted with something that is unexpected - especially when it is something grander than we normally encounter - the human reflex is to withdraw, often fearfully!

There is a part of me that deeply desires to see the glory of God, to share in the experience



of Peter, James, and John as well as to behold the wonder of the Lord in heaven.



thought of that

makes me nervous - how do I stand before the greatness of the Lord and not wither away? The fear of the disciples is very relatable!

Jesus sees the anxiety of the disciples, comes to them, touching them and reassuring them: "Rise, and do not afraid". He is implicitly reminding them that He *wants* them with Him, that He invited them to join Him on the mountain, and that they are welcome - sinful even as they are - to come to Him. May we not hesitate to come to the Lord, allowing Him to reassure us of our place beside Him, to purify us of our sins, and to share in His glory. This Lent, Saint Mark parishioners are invited to take part in the Saturday evening 'Restore' meditations & discussions. These take place immediately after the vigil Mass in Sullivan Hall.

In addition to this



program, I'd like to heartily recommend Sister Miriam's book *Loved as I Am*. In today's Gospel we heard the Father call Jesus His beloved, so we are invited to hear God's love for us, too, as His beloved sons & daughters. Sister Miriam gently and wonderfully breaks open this mystery in this book - check it out!

The Church's tradition of the **Easter duty** (the precept that we receive communion at least annually, preferably during Easter) is a great prompt for us to **go to confession**. To

assist in that preparation, extra confession times will be offered through Lent!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: How will priests be selected for the new parish family?

A: As with all priest placements, the Priest Personnel Board (PPB), made up of priests and Chancery leaders, makes recommendations to Archbishop Etienne. Each priest will have an individual conversation about their desires and how they would like to serve in the future either as a pastor, a parochial vicar or in a different supportive role.

Q: What does this mean for parishioners?

A: Overall, parishioners should experience a more vibrant and engaged Catholic community. They will have more opportunities for personal faith growth and the opportunity for a closer relationship with their parish leaders.

Practically, it also means that parishioners will experience administrative changes. This will differ by parish family, but some changes might include a new pastor and parochial vicar, changes to Mass times and locations, and new outreach ministry opportunities.

Q: What does this mean for schools?

March 5, 2023

A: Schools are a vital ministry of a parish, and they will benefit from stronger parish families through Partners in the Gospel. In the near term, there will be no changes for Catholic schools. Parishes will be placed in a new parish family in 2024 and then the parish family will have three years to determine how it would like to join together. This planning process will include discernment around all ministries, including Catholic schools.

Catholic schools are key to our formation and evangelization efforts in the Archdiocese of Seattle. Determining how to ensure the growth and vitality of Catholic schools into the future will remain the work of school and parish leaders and school boards/commissions.

These leaders may draw upon the Partners in the Gospel resources and tools, as well as the support of the parish liaison.
