Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel. Hosanna in the highest.

Palm Sunday begins Holy Week, and with that we recall the joy with which Christ was received into our midst - at both Christmas and His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem and the Passion He endured at our hands that led to His death on the cross.

A hallmark of our faith is how we place Christ's crucifixion front and center. Though it is uncomfortable to behold His body and to consider our part in His suffering, we know glossing over the cross robs the Lord's work of its power. The resurrection is meaningless without the cross - and the tomb - of Christ.

Let us meditate on the death of Christ, especially in the pravers and services of the Triduum, so that we might more fully praise the Lord for His victory on our behalf.

April 2, 2023

Spy Wednesday marks the end of Lent, so called because it is the day Judas betrayed Jesus.



Cf. Mt 21:9

We will mark this day with a

Tenebrae service or the 'Service of Shadows'. It is called this because it takes place with the church illuminated primarily by an arrangement of fifteen candles called a hearse.

As we pray the fifteen psalms, broken into three parts called Nocturns, a candle is extinguished after each psalm until only one remains. The last candle is removed and the strepitus rings out - the closing of Jesus' tomb. Our Tenebrae service will be at 6:30 pm - a wonderful way to start the Sacred Triduum!

Of the many celebrations during the Sacred Triduum, not all Catholics may be familiar with the Tre Ore - the Three Hours Devotion. Observed from noon to three o'clock, it is a time of meditation on the agony of Christ on the Cross and His seven last words.

Though the altar remains stripped and the tabernacle A LAS TRES HORAS empty, we gather to pray in the church. Confessions will be heard and homilies offered roughly every 15 minutes on each of the last words of the Lord. Come join in this time of prayer & reflection from 12:00 pm to 3:00 pm on Friday.
