Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

Cf. Is 48: 20

"Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope" - 1 Peter 3:15

In today's second reading, Saint Peter exhorts us to be ready to share - gently, reverently, with neither defensiveness nor aggression - the basis of our hope: Jesus Christ.

It is a refreshing reminder of the simplicity of discipleship. Of course we ought to read the Scriptures regularly, study the teachings of our faith often, and (most importantly) spend time with the Lord in prayer every single day. But sharing our faith is as simple as talking about what we love, about *Who* we love.

Take time this week to reflect on your own story of faith. Why are you a follower of Christ? How did you enter the Body of Christ? What are the experiences that have convinced you to stay close to the Lord and His Church?
