WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?



See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

Cf. Ps 54 (53): 6, 8

The phrase 'by His wounds we are healed' - first written by Isaiah and later echoed in the writing of Saint Peter - is a radical proclamation of God's chosen means of forgiveness. The Lord chooses to show His glory, to restore our glory, by using the very means of our hurt to bring about hurt's cure.

In the Old Testament, we see this time and again - in punishment for their fickle faith, the



Lord sent serpents among the people. To heal them, an image of a serpent was mounted in their midst - all who saw it were restored.

Romans 8:28

Artist: Full of Eyes sins, particularly in their confession and

forgiveness. Though the Lord could simply wipe away our iniquities, He has us offer them - not sacrifices or offerings, but our sins! - to Him. It is through that confession of sins that He transforms us; we discover His extraordinary love and re-discover our dignity by offering that which first debased us.

The first reading concludes with the reminder that "you gave your children good ground for hope that you would permit repentance for their sins" (Wisdom 12:19). May we follow through on that hope, approaching the Lord with neither disbelief nor temerity, but trusting in His wondrous mercy.

This Tuesday, July 25, is the feast day of Saint James the Greater (one of the two 'sons of thunder' - the other being his brother, Saint John). Exactly why he is called 'the greater' is uncertain - perhaps due to greater age (or



possibly height) than the other James among the twelve Apostles.

In any case, today we remember the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Seattle and ask his intercession on our behalf!

Deacon Kirk and I will be hosting a summertime 'Ask Me Anything' series. There will be a brief presentation on a hot-button topic and then we will open the floor to your questions - on-topic or any topic on your



mind. We hope you'll join us for one, some, or all of the sessions! Come also for the food! :-)
