₩JMJ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Look to your covenant, O Lord, and forget not the life of your poor ones for ever. Arise, O God, and defend your cause, and forget not the cries of those who seek you. *Cf. Ps 74 (73): 20, 19, 22, 23*

In his homily at last Sunday's Mass for the World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal, Pope Francis emphasized three actions: *shine*, *listen*, and *to be unafraid*.

This Sunday we see the prophet Elijah listening to and for the Lord - following God's instruction to await His presence, and listening attentively so that he wouldn't miss the moment when God passed by him. As a result, he was able to distinguish between the sound & fury of worldly things and the true presence of God in the tiny whispering sound.



I wonder if sometimes we stop with the first of Pope Francis' three actions - focusing on our own brilliance.... or perhaps despairing that God's glory is not shining through us in the way we or He so desires.

Maybe we are also fearful, worrying that if we listen, God might overwhelm us or ask for something contrary to our own desires!

For just a brief moment, Saint Peter experienced the glory & joy of listening and responding to the Lord. Though he later feared, he walked on water with Jesus! Especially in retrospect, that moment must have been one that Peter returned to often. May we turn attentively to the Lord, trusting His call to be gentle and His plan to be good. August 14 is the **memorial of Saint Maximilian Kolbe**. He was a priest for the Conventual Franciscans, serving in China, Japan, and India, before returning to Poland, his homeland.



During WWII, his monastery - which often issued anti-Nazi publications - was shut down and Kolbe taken to Auschwitz. While there, he volunteered to take the place of a husband & father who had been chosen for execution by starvation. Kolbe led the prisoners in prayer daily and was eventually killed by injection with carbolic acid. He was cremated on the feast of the Assumption of Mary, to whom he had a lifelong devotion.

Saint Mark parish is in need of volunteers! As we look to the end of summer and the beginning of fall, we find ourselves in need of **ushers** and **lectors** for weekend Masses (Saturday vigil and Sunday morning). Ushers and lectors are scheduled once a month, though they may serve more if they want to.

The ministries of ushering and reading at Mass are **vital parts** of our gathering as a community to celebrate Mass each weekend. Though there are a few pre-requisites, they are relatively few and easy to fulfill!
