WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Turn your eyes, O God, our shield; and look on the face of your anointed one; one day within your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.

Cf. s 84 (83): 10-11

As we read today's passage from the prophet Isaiah, we ought to consider to whom the Lord is speaking as He invites them to a 'house of prayer for all peoples' (Isaiah 56:7).

The obvious answer isn't hard to find - the same verse starts with the subject: "The foreigners who join themselves to the Lord". I imagine that most of us don't see ourselves as foreigners in the house of the Lord - there is a sense not just of belonging but ownership, of having a right to our place in God's house.



But we are foreigners in the Lord's house - not by nationality, race, or creed, but due to Original Sin, our particular sins and our

Exodus 17:17, Full of Eyes sinful desires.

Thanks be to God, we are all invited to live with Him in heaven, starting with our gathering in His Church here on earth. But notice the description of **our** responsibilities: that we minister to Him, love His name, become His servants, make holy the sabbath and hold to His covenant.

What might change in our practice of the faith if we truly regarded ourselves as foreigners in a new land, guests to a gracious Host - Whom we ought to strive to serve, praise, and glorify!

This Tuesday is the memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

An unofficial octave of Mary (eight days, starting since the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin), we conclude the celebration with her coronation as queen of heaven.



The understanding of a queen mother comes from our Jewish roots. The prince, now succeeding his father as the king, would have his mother (the former queen) as an advisor for him and an advocate of the people. May we likewise turn to Mary to advocate for us!

This month I started a weekly 'pastor's post' on our parish website, inspired by some of my brother priests' habit of creating & sending out a weekly e-mail to their parishioners. Rather than spring that on folks - especially knowing that we all have too much unexpected (or junk!) mail in our inboxes, I've gone the route of a post to our website.

My practice is to have the new post go up early Monday mornings (~6 am) - perhaps it might be something to read over coffee before jumping into the week. You can find the latest
