WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

Cf. Ps 86 (85): 1-3

"And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." - Matthew 16

In today's Gospel, Christ gives His Apostles the authority to bind & loose sins - the foundation of the sacrament of confession.

We know that Jesus came for the forgiveness of sins, that He took - and takes - responsibility for our sins. As we read in Isaiah 53, "he was pierced for our sins, crushed for



our iniquity. He bore the punishment that makes us whole, by his wounds we were healed."

Even in His wondrous sacrifice, Jesus is mindful of our freedom - He will not impose upon it in even the slightest way.

He waits for us to open our hearts to Him, to choose to accept the great gifts in store for us.

With the ball in our court, what happens next is entirely up to each of us. This photo, taken at the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls in Rome, shows the chains of the Apostle. Even physically imprisoned, he celebrated his freedom in Christ - a freedom he embraced because he accepted Jesus' call.

May we likewise open our hearts to the Lord, confessing our sins and receiving His mercy.

This Tuesday, August 29, we celebrate the Passion of Saint John the Baptist. He was martyred by Herod at the



urging of his daughter - herself influenced by her mother, Herodias (herself furious at Saint John's rebuke of Herod marrying her - the exwife of Herod's brother).

Saint John, who famously said of Jesus that 'I must decrease, He must increase', was unafraid to proclaim the truth even when it came at personal cost. The Vatican News website has a thoughtful article for our reflection and consideration. May we, like Saint John, make our own confession of faith!

This month our parish staff took part in an input session for *Partners in the Gospel* - it was a fruitful time for them to



express their concerns & anxieties as well as their hopes & dreams for what might come from the *Partners in the Gospel* project.
