

"Let Justice and Peace Flow"

I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever.

Today we hear the complaint of the workers in the parable Jesus offers us. Often we see their objection as decrying unfairness - that those who worked only briefly are being paid the same amount as those who worked all day.

But the workers reveal their hearts in the words they use: "you have made them equal to us[!]". Not only do they want more money, *they've judged other as less deserving, not to be lifted up.*

The great scandal of the cross is that Jesus offers His mercy to all. Think about the



implications for a moment: that *everyone* is offered forgiveness - and with it eternal life with the Lord in heaven.

Murderers, adulterers, abusers, thieves, cheats, embezzlers, dictators, gossips, fornicators, liars, heretics, the lazy, the cruel - these and indeed any & every kind of sinner could be - is **invited** to be! - in heaven. With a single moment of repentance, they can receive the same promise as was received by the good thief next to Jesus at His crucifixion: "today you will be with me in Paradise". (Luke 23:24)

Jesus asks a key question: "Are you envious because I am generous?". May we pray to be ready not only to receive God's mercy but to rejoice that He so freely offers it to all, spreading that good news to the world. This Thursday (September 21) we celebrate **the feast day of Saint Matthew**, evangelist and apostle.

His Gospel is often represented with a divine man, itself taken from the Prophet



Ezekiel (1:1021) and the book of Revelation (4:6-8). St. Irenaeus explains that this is because Matthew's Gospel highlights Jesus' incarnation, especially His lineage and birth.

Let us ask Saint Matthew's intercession for ourselves and for our south neighboring parish as we together celebrate their patron!

As we move into the public input phase of *Partners in the Gospel* - particularly as we discern how we



might respond to our draft parish family configuration (Saint Mark, Saint Matthew, and Saint Catherine parishes), I am making a change to our weekend Mass intentions.

Starting next weekend, the vigil & Sunday Mass intentions will be for the people of each parish in our draft parish family. The 5 pm vigil Mass will be for Saint Catherine parish, the 8:30 am Mass for Saint Matthew parish, and the 10:30 am Mass for Saint Mark parish. Together in prayer & worship we will invite the Lord to bless our communities and our discernment as we continue forward. ₩JMJ¥ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Why is the archdiocese going through the Partners in the Gospel process?

The short answer is that we are facing radical decreases in parishioners and priests. We have 174 locations that are currently being led by 80 diocesan pastors. The archdiocese is projecting that by 2036, we will have only 66 diocesan pastors. Compounding this is the reality of dwindling finances versus the ongoing repair & upkeep of our campuses - most of our parishes (67%) are operating at a deficit. If you haven't already, watch the *Current Reality Report* video for more detail.

How will Partners in the Gospel help?

The purpose of the *Partners in the Gospel* is to give parishioners the ability to provide input and take an active role in building & renewing the Church in the Pacific Northwest. Modeled after the Synodal Way, parishioners from multiple locations are being invited to come together to form new, vibrant parish communities. Each new parish family will benefit from shared gifts, talents, finances, and resources - allowing us to carry out the mission of the Church locally and regionally.

What is the archdiocese doing about vocations?

In 2022, Archbishop Etienne restructured the vocations program of the archdiocese, moving from a single, centrally located vocations director to a more regional focus. As part of this, he appointed three new priests to serve as associate directors of vocations under the guidance of the current director of vocations (Father Justin Ryan). Of course, *vocations start at home*, which is why at Saint Mark parish we are restoring a devotional practice given to us by one of our former pastors, Father Harris. After every Mass, we will be turning to the back inside cover of our Saint Michael hymnal and praying our prayer for vocations. Notably, this prayer implores God to inspire vocations to the priesthood not only from elsewhere, but from among our own community & families. Perhaps now more than ever, we all must consider God's call in our own lives and encourage each other to be open to His will.
