

# WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and his strength; constantly seek his face.

Cf. Ps 105 (104): 3-4

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with *all* your heart, *all* your soul, and with *all* your mind." (Matthew 22:37 - emphasis added)

This last Thursday (October 26), we listened to Jesus' desire that the earth was already blazing. That sentiment struck me as especially plaintive; that the Lord was sorrowfully declaring the sad state of our hearts - practically pleading for His disciples and we who follow after to allow ourselves to be inflamed with His will, to join in His work.

What would it look like to love God with *all* of my heart, soul, and mind? Honestly, that sounds exhausting! What would I have left for what *I* want to do, for the things I *need* to do?

Yet Jesus never asks in half-measures - He is not satisfied with a portion of who we are or what we are about; He wants all of us. And isn't there something extraordinarily flattering about that? Jesus isn't needy: He doesn't *need* anything! So, when He asks, He is asking purely out of desire - desire for *us*!

As we consider the Lord's call - perhaps with anxious or reluctant hearts - may we consider His complete self-giving, holding nothing back. May we invite the Holy Spirit to inflame our hearts, helping us to entrust them to God.

This Wednesday is the **Solemnity of All Saints** and a holy day of obligation. We will be celebrating two



Masses - one at 9:30 am and one at 6:30 pm.

All Saints is meant to be a day of praising all the citizens in heaven as well as imploring their intercession on our behalf. While we know a great many of the saints, there are countless others we don't know. We have this day to ensure that we acknowledge all of them, even if only in general. May we ask their help, that we may one day join them!

Each year, during the fall season, we are invited to renew - or begin for the first time! - our support for the financial and material needs of Saint Mark parish.

It is a common misconception that the Catholic Church is a monolithic institution, with the assets to match! In truth, each parish - though acting in union with a local bishop and the Pope - stands on its own financially. Though clergy have ecclesial authority over

and responsibility for a parish, it thrives because of its *members*.
