

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation!

Cf. Ps 38 (37): 22-23

In the middle of today's Gospel, Jesus makes a damning observation about the scribes & Pharisees: "They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them."

At first reading, it is tempting to apply this description to those around us - looking to the various authority figures in our lives and echoing Jesus' evaluation. And while there may be some merit to those kinds of complaints, this is a temptation because it turns the Lord's words away from their intended target: us!
