

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## WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Be my protector, O God, a mighty stronghold to save me. For you are my rock, my stronghold! Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name.

Cf. Ps 31 (30): 3-4

This Sunday's readings provide us with a helpful run-up to the Lenten season. In addition to being a terrible disease, leprosy is a symbolic stand-in for sin. Though most of us (happily) do not suffer from leprosy, we ALL suffer from sin - our own and that of others.

Jesus' coming offers us - and all of humanity - a cure that is not only material (as with the leper) but spiritual: He is Lord of both the earth and the heavens, curing ailments of both body and soul.



Though we might think we can hide spiritual sickness, it eventually becomes just as obvious as the symptoms of leprosy: our brokenness ultimately permeates all that we are and do. But that need not be the end of the story!

With just a touch, Jesus heals the leper and with just a word, He forgives sin.

What is so lacking is not Jesus' willingness or power, but our acknowledgement of our need for Him. May we take to heart not only Christ's actions, but the leper's initiative: he came to Jesus and begged for help! We must similarly approach Him, asking for the help we need.

Let us take full advantage of this season, that we may ask for & receive God's merciful love. This Wednesday, February 14, we celebrate **Ash Wednesday** and the beginning of Lent.

The Church's tradition of the **Easter duty** (the precept that we receive communion at least annually, preferably during Easter) is a great prompt for us to **go to confession**. To assist in that preparation, extra confession

times will be offered through Lent!

## WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Dear friends,

With Ash Wednesday this week, we enter into the Lenten season, reflecting on Jesus' earthly ministry and preparing ourselves for the celebration of His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

Lent brings with it several changes to our liturgical celebrations. One of the most noticeable is with music. At Saint Mark parish - as with most parishes of the archdiocese - we take this opportunity to add solemnity to our Masses by praying various parts of the Mass in the Latin, the language of the Roman Catholic Church. This Lent, and throughout the Easter season that follows, we will be praying the 'Our Father' in Latin.

This practice takes its cue from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (#41), which tells us that "Since the faithful from different countries come together ever more frequently, it is desirable that they know how to sing together at least some parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin, especially the Profession of Faith and the Lord's Prayer, according to the simpler settings." I think you'll agree that between the Profession of Faith and the Lord's Prayer, praying the latter in Latin is by far the easier option. But perhaps some day we'll explore the Creed in Latin, too!

Regarding other music - and decorations, the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (#305) also guides us, reminding us that "During Lent it is forbidden for the altar to be decorated with flowers. Exceptions, however, are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts." Just a few paragraphs later (#313), it also speaks about music during Lent: "In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only in order to support the singing. Exceptions, however, are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts."

In short - both musically and visually - we will enter into the desert of Lent with Jesus!

Though we will miss the more joyful elements of the Mass (no *Gloria* or *Alleluia* for a while), let us use the coming seven weeks to more deeply reflect on Christ's sacrifice and how we might open ourselves to the graces He won for us.
