The handicrafts trade in the Holy Land has evolved as a cultural tradition of the Holy Land people over many centuries and has become an industry of significance to the local economy. Beautiful handmade souvenirs made from the native olive tree provide Christian pilgrims with cherished memorials of their holy pilgrim-

age. Olivewood artisans use only the pruned and discarded pieces

of young olive trees and sprouts from the old, unproductive trees. The artistry of Mother-of-Pearl is a tradition traced to the earth 17th century and has evolved along with the olivewood trade.

#### **Partners in the Gospel Discernment Continues**

Based on the input from the public consultation phase last fall, changes were recommended for 25 parish families, which impacted 78 individual parishes and missions. These parishes and missions were invited to hold a second round of listening with their parishioners to gather input on the updated version of their parish family. This feedback has been incorporated into the discernment process.

Discernment is different than simply "making a decision." It involves prayer and quiet time to listen to the Holy Spirit to understand the direction this journey should take us. At this time, we ask everyone to continue praying for this effort.

### **Updated Q&A**

Throughout the consultation process, new questions arose regarding Partners in the Gospel, the process, the purpose and more. Please see highlights below:

Q: How are we cultivating priestly vocations?

A: The Archdiocesan vocations team has expanded to include a full-time vocations director and three associate vocations directors. This has led to more opportunities to accompany young men discerning and to invite others to consider the priesthood. Specifically, our vocations team focuses on prayer, education and encouragement.

- Prayer: Following our Lord Jesus' invitation to ask for laborers to serve in the harvest, parishes around the archdiocese regularly host Holy Hours dedicated to praying for vocations, as well as Serra Club chapters and other lay groups.
- Education: The vocations team is present at parishes, schools and diocesan events and retreats to teach people about vocations and how to discern them. This message is echoed through several communication efforts, including the annual seminarian poster, Vocations website and social media channels.
- Encouragement: Through events like discernment retreats and Quo Vadis Days, young men are encouraged to consider priesthood and to discern their vocation.

### **Upcoming Key Dates**

**Feb. 3-4, 2024** – Final parish family plan will be announced.

**Spring 2024 –** Pastors and parochial vicars announced.

**July 2024** – Parish families, under the leadership of one pastor, will begin.

## WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

Cf. Ps 91 (90): 15-16

Though Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, today marks the 'firsts' of the season. Acclimated - at least slightly - to the sobriety of this time of preparation, we enter in earnest into the desert.

Throughout His ministry, people took Jesus' humanity for granted - they wanted proof that He was God. Now, 2000+ years later, it seems to me that we take His divinity for granted. But Jesus' humanity is equally crucial to who He is.

Ivan Kramoskoy's image of Christ in the Wilderness conveys a sense of the Lord that

we might otherwise shy away from: His weakness in the face of struggles. Artists often gravitate to a glorified Christ emerging from the tomb or Him

crucified on the cross. But here we see Jesus sitting hunched over in a barren landscape, barefoot on rocky terrain, wrapped up with heavy robes against the elements, hands clenched together, with a haggard expression on His face. Determined, surely - but already deeply feeling the weight of His calling.

This is where we are being invited to join the Lord - to sit quietly with Him in His sorrow and struggles, consoling Him not so much with words or works but our very presence. Let us take this time to accompany Him in the desert.

This Thursday, **February**22, we celebrate the feast of the Chair of Saint Peter the Apostle. Though the original chair is preserved at Saint Peter's basilica in Rome, it is the spiritual significance that we are truly celebrating.

The Vicar of Christ, the successor to Saint Peter - the pope - is the visible and principle sign of unity. In His love for us, the Lord gives us the pope as His representative. Let us pray for Pope Francis and the Church, that we may be ever united.

The Church's tradition of the **Easter duty** (the precept that we receive communion at least annually, preferably during Easter) is a great prompt for us to **go to confession**. To assist in that preparation, extra confession

times will be offered through Lent!
