WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

Cf. Ps 25 (24): 15-16

Some shared with me recently how they struggled to find a helpful examination of conscience for confession. I've experienced that frustration - there are an overwhelming number of options! The bishops' website has a dedicated page that has not one or two, but EIGHT versions. Oofda.

As both a priest confessor and a penitent, I find the Ten Commandments to be most helpful in making a full inventory of sins needing confessed to the Lord. I approach

each commandment with the following question: how might I have disobeyed this commandment in thought, word, or deed?

Especially with the heavier commandments (the 5th & 6th, especially), it is also helpful to ask myself: how might I have disobeyed

this commandment literally or spiritually?

The painful truth is that when I consider the ten commandments in light of these two questions, there is always sin revealed - even if it is only venial sin rather than mortal sin!

But as today's collect (the opening prayer) reminds us, we are both bowed down by our conscience AND lifted up by God's mercy. May we seek to acknowledge our sins, trusting that the Lord delights in healing & restoring us.

Some parishioners have asked about the absence of the **sign of peace** at Mass during the season of Lent. There was some question of whether or not I was forgetting to do it!



Rest assured, its absence is both deliberate and temporary! The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* gives the priest discretion to include or omit the communal sign of peace. As a part of the sobriety of the Lenten season, I am omitting it until Easter - but rest assure that, along with the *Gloria*, *Alleluia*, and flowers, the sign of peace will return this Easter Sunday!

The Church's tradition of the **Easter duty** (the precept that we receive communion at least annually, preferably during Easter) is a great prompt for us to **go to confession**. To assist in that preparation, extra confession

times will be offered through Lent!
