WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Give me justice, O God, and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless.
From the deceitful and cunning rescue me, for you, O God, are my strength.

Cf. Ps 43 (42): 1-2

Experienced Catholics will know that our Mass readings run on a three-year cycle for Sundays and a two-year cycle for weekdays. Though there is some repetition, the lectionary (the collection of readings of Sunday & weekday Masses) is constructed such that there is minimal repetition overall.

This Tuesday, March 19, is the **Solemnity of Saint Joseph**. We celebrate the special place of the foster father of Jesus. In the Scriptures, Mary speaks on six different occasions - Joseph is altogether silent!



The Liturgy of the Hours - the daily prayers of the Church - follow a different, but complementary practice: its ALL about praying over the same texts. Instead of counting in

Nonetheless, Joseph was integral to Jesus' growth and formation as one of us. It was Joseph who taught Him how to be a man, who modeled earthly fatherhood, who helped Jesus become the man that He was and is. years, the cycle of the Divine Office repeats every four **weeks**.

I mention this because one of the prayers that is the same *every* week is the first psalm of Morning Prayer on Fridays: it is Psalm 51 - which we proclaimed together today at Mass.

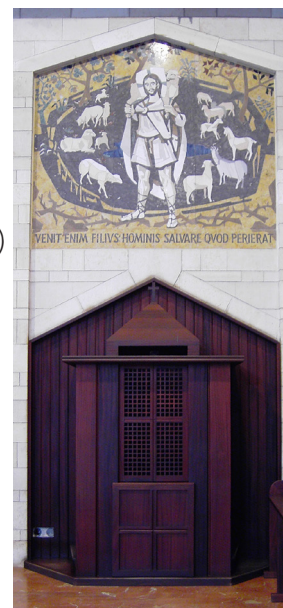
The Church's tradition of the **Easter duty** (the precept that we receive communion at least annually, preferably during Easter) is a great prompt for us to **go to confession**. To assist in that preparation, extra confession times will be offered through Lent!

We need this weekly reminder - chosen to be on Fridays to call to mind Jesus' death on the same day - because we so desperately need clean hearts..... and because we so easily blacken our hearts & souls with sin.
