
WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel. Hosanna in the highest.

Cf. Mt 21:9

Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani
My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?



The transition from welcoming Jesus in procession with palms to witnessing His Passion and death is jarring. But one moment that stands out to me is Jesus' cry to His heavenly Father - an exclamation of deep

despair, hopelessness, and sorrow.

We know that the Father never abandoned or forsook Jesus - so why does He say this? Scripture scholars will point out that the Lord is quoting Psalm 22, which itself foreshadows Jesus' suffering and the mockery He endured.

Crucial to understanding this is remembering that Jesus is both divine **and** human - and what is more common to human experience than feeling far from God? Though He is like us in all things but sin, in the crucifixion He bore the full weight of our sins. It makes perfect sense that He would echo our cry, speaking for and with all of humanity.

What is consoling even here is the implicit invitation: part of joining our suffering with Christ's is sharing - articulating, even! - our despair, hopelessness, and sorrow. We place it all at the cross, at the altar of Jesus' sacrifice, knowing that the Father tenderly receives it - and that these, too, will be transformed.

Tenebrae (or 'the Service of Shadows') is a liturgical service of chanted psalms and readings, reflecting on the death of the Lord.

As each psalm concludes, one of fifteen candles is extinguished, until the final candle alone lights the church. It is carried

out and a loud noise (the *strepitus*) signifies the closing of Christ's tomb. After praying the Our Father, all depart in silence.

Tenebrae will be at 6:30 pm this Wednesday

The **Tre Ore (3 hours) service** is a liturgy held on Good Friday from noon until 3 o'clock, meditating on the Passion of Christ.

Over the three hours, there are homilies offered on the seven last words of Christ. As we prayerfully reflect on these final utterances of Christ before His death, we unite ourselves more intentionally with His suffering.

At Saint Mark, confessions will be heard between the seven homilies. The Stations of the Cross will be prayed at the conclusion of the service.
