I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

Cf. Ps 139 (138): 18, 5-6

Happy Easter! At long last we come to the conclusion of Lent & the Triduum. Having spent forty days in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we now enter into fifty days of Easter celebration. Together with Christians across the ages, we call out that 'He is risen -He is risen indeed!'



At the Easter vigil - in the light of candles held by all in attendance the *Exultet* was chanted. <u>The</u> words of that hymn never fail to touch my heart and quite often choke me

up even as they are sung. We exult with the hosts of heaven, we are glad with all the earth, we rejoice as the Church - the Body of Christ!

It is the final part of this prayer that remains yet unfulfilled: "may this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star". Having come back from death's domain, Christ has accomplished His victory for us - but that work is only complete when we receive, proclaim, and live out His Gospel!

Though the Easter fire only burned briefly last night, we are renewed in the Holy Spirit. May we carry the flame of faith forth to our families, friends, and all those we meet! Today begins **the octave of Easter** - eight days celebrating the resurrection of the Lord. Unlike any other octave in the liturgical year, *each day* is a solemnity! We rejoice and celebrate for a whole week (plus a day) Christ's victory over sin & death. Let us make each day of this week joyful, thanking and praising God for His triumph on our behalf.



Congratulations to all those received into the Church this Easter! We are delighted to welcome those who were baptized & confirmed as Catholics, as well as celebrate with those members of our



community who were confirmed with them.

Thank you, too, to our team of parishioners who have spent the last many months guiding these students - and several others still preparing for their sacraments - in exploring various aspects of our faith.
