

# ₩JMJ ₩ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

When we reflect on the imagery of the good shepherd, we often - rightly! - focus on the implication that we are the Lord's sheep. Treasured by God, He reassures us that even if it means leaving the ninety-nine, He will not allow the one to be abandoned or forgotten. He knows us and loves us dearly, praise God!

What catches my eye - and, if I'm brutally frank, convicts my heart - is the second half of Jesus' statement: "I know mine **and mine** 



know me". While there is no doubt that we are the Lord's sheep, I can't deny that I do not always acknowledge Him as my shepherd - and at times, I *don't* know Him... at least, not as intimately as I ought.

The kind of knowing

that I think Jesus is highlighting is not simply an intellectual knowledge, but of relationship. Study of Christ is of course all well and good, but that can't be the basis of true friendship. Memorizing my family tree might give me insights into history, but it is in the encounter with my grandparents and aunts & uncles where I begin to really know them.

From that vantage point - and with gentle but frank honesty - we do well to ask: how well do we know Jesus? May we take the opportunities we have - especially in prayer - to encounter and engage with Him, that we truly know Him.

This Thursday, April 25 is the feast of Saint Mark. Author of the Gospel of Mark and patron of our parish, he is depicted with a lion because of how his gospel begins: the message of John the Baptist ringing

out in the wilderness like a lion.

There is a time for meekness, as Jesus was during His Passion, and a time for boldness, as His Apostles were after His resurrection, ascension, and His promised sending of the Holy Spirit. May we joyfully & faithfully proclaim the Gospel in all we do.

This Sunday and last, we celebrated a total of four folks receiving baptism and/or confirmation at Saint Mark parish - these were students from our adult faith formation program who couldn't celebrate at the Easter vigil, so we scheduled



their reception of the sacraments later. Please join me in congratulating both our new Catholics and those Catholics who received the sacrament of confirmation.

We are excited to have all of our (former) students fully initiated into the Catholic Church, and we look forward to seeing how the work of the Lord unfolds in their lives!
