WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

Cf. Ps 98 (97): 1-2

It is always fruitful to reflect on our relationship with God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But our relationship with each other is no less important - the Lord Himself speaks to how we must be at peace with each other before coming to the altar (Matthew 5:21-24).

Today's first reading gives us an example of how the early Church struggled with this. Paul, formerly Saul - infamously persecuting and killing Christians - presents himself to the



Church as a fellow believer. Rather than receiving him with joy and celebration, they were all afraid of him - which seems understandable!

That fear eventually faded as Barnabus testified on his behalf

and, later on, Paul demonstrated the depth of his newfound faith in Jesus Christ. But I can't help but wonder how long it took for his fellow believers to fully accept and trust him.

We, too, often hold a seed of suspicion towards each other. Wounded by the world and other people, we are slow to trust and quick to judge - not necessarily out of malice, but rather with the goal of avoiding being hurt again. But that is no way to live! Being united with the Lord and each other requires that we open our hearts to love and be loved. May we invite the Lord to help us love each other as He loves us.

In the Archdiocese of Seattle, a great number of priests celebrate the anniversary of their ordination in May and June. In addition to thanking priests for their ministry, this is a wonderful opportunity to pray for vocations. Here at Saint Mark, we offer a vocation prayer after every Mass - but it need not stop there! Parishioners can sign up to have the Saint John Vianney statue for a week, praying as a household for priestly vocation. Those who desire to pray together in the church might consider our Monday evening rosary, or simply coming to the church to pray throughout the week! Let us together invite the Lord to call men from our community to service in the Church as priests.

This Wednesday, May 1, at 6:30 pm, Bishop Elizondo will celebrate the Confirmation Mass for those youth in our parish who have been preparing for their final sacrament of initiation.



Our seven students have been gathering in study & prayer since

September. Together with our Confirmation team leaders, they have explored the various tenets of our faith, considered their own relationship with the Lord, and discerned His call to greater discipleship in the Church and the world. Join us this Wednesday as they receive the sacrament of Confirmation!
