

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

Cf. Is 48: 20

While I travelled to the Olympic Peninsula this week (and preparing to do so once again this week!), I had plenty of time to listen to one of my favorite podcasts, *Restore the Glory*. The episode that has been taking up a good amount of my prayer time lately is episode 87 - in which they spent time with Dr. Karl Lehman talking about his 'Immanuel Approach' to encounter with Jesus.

Their reflections resonated with me again when considering todays readings - particularly



the first reading and the Gospel. First there is the reminder of our common humanity emphasizing both our shared humble state and God's impartiality. Secondly, there is Jesus' reminder that the greatest commandment is love of

God and each other.

Dr. Lehman's 'Immanuel Approach' is one of resting in past experiences of love, inviting Jesus to enter into those experiences, asking Him to share of Himself there, equipping us to likewise love others.

I have been struck by the graces I receive when I first start my day by dwelling on the love & care I have been given and inviting the Lord to renew His love & care for me. May we together explore how God has loved each of us, that we may fulfill His command to do likewise.

Throughout this last week, we have spent time in the various Gospel readings meditating on loving as Jesus loves - and that that is only truly possible by being branches that remain close to Him, the true vine.



As Catholics, closeness to Christ starts with five precepts: Mass on Sundays & holy days, yearly confession, yearly reception of the Eucharist, observing the days of fasting & abstinence, and helping provide for the needs of the Church. (CCC 2041-2043) These are a useful starting place to draw near to Him!

This Friday we celebrate the memorial of Saint Damien de Veuster, more commonly called Saint Damien of Molokai.

Saint Damien's story is one of extraordinary pastoral care. Born in Belgium, he became a priest in the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. When his brother - also a priest in the congregation - couldn't go to the Hawaiian Islands to serve, Damien

volunteered. Nearly ten years later, he volunteered again - to serve at the leper colony on Moloka'i. He spent the remainder of his life there, sharing in the life, suffering, and death of those whom he served. Saint Damien, pray for us!
