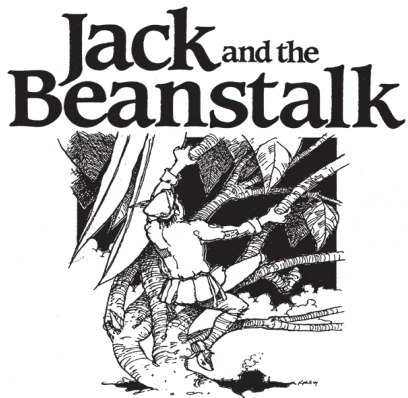

# WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

*Cf. Acts 1: 11*

Among the readings for this solemnity of the Ascension, two verses stuck out to me. In the first reading, the last line from the from the Acts of the Apostles:

They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.” (Acts 1:11)

And then this, at the end of Mark’s Gospel:

“But they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs.” (Mark 16:20)



I can’t help but wonder about hearts of the Apostles *between* the Ascension and their going forth. They must have felt confusion, anxiety, frustration, and even anger at Jesus’ apparent abandonment, wondering why they were left to their own

devices and how they were supposed to go on.

In our own period of in-between - anticipating the coming of new priests and whatever the mission field of being a parish family might hold - we perhaps find ourselves more united with the early Church than we had guessed!

As we look towards Pentecost, especially aware of our tensions & struggles, may we use this time to present them to God, trusting that He will send us His Spirit as well, preparing us for the missionary work He entrusts to us.

This Tuesday, May 14th is **the feast of Saint Matthias, Apostle and martyr**. I have a particular affinity for him, carrying his name as my middle name.



Chosen by the Holy Spirit to replace Judas, little more is known about him beyond the fact that he was present throughout Jesus’ ministry. Legend says that though he was condemned to death by the high priest in Judea, it miraculously failed to take his life, so he was killed with an ax (thus the image of him holding one). Saint Matthias, pray for us!

This weekend (Saturday, May 18 3pm & 6:30 pm), the students of our school will perform **Jack and the Beanstalk**. Having rehearsed all week under the tutelage of Missoula Children’s Theatre, they will have it all: singing, dancing, and storytelling!

As a fan of community theater - of regular folks taking up acting & singing together! - this is one of the highlights of the year for me. All ages of students were welcome to audition and everyone on the stage clearly has a blast, wholeheartedly putting themselves into their character(s) and the story being told. I hope you’ll join me in enjoying the show this coming Saturday!
