

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.

In today's first reading, Moses exhorts the people with these words:

Ask now of the days of old, before your time, ever since God created man upon the earth; ask from one end of the sky to the other: Did anything so great ever happen before?

We would do well to consider this question ourselves, blessed as we are beyond the imagination of even the Israelites of Moses' time. Instead of coming in the splendor of



fire and cloud, God humbled Himself by taking our flesh. Rather than offering bread or quail, He gives us His very flesh and blood. The new covenant that Jesus offers is but a precursor to being joined with Him to the Father and the

Holy Spirit in heaven!

Did anything so great ever happen before? No! What is offered to us, though foreshadowed in the mighty works of God in ages past, is new, extraordinary, and utterly gratuitous: we are invited to enter into the very life of God.

While human efforts to explain the 'what' of the Trinity will inevitably fall short, we have all we need to explain the 'who' of the three-fold Godhead. Our baptism and our communion give us all we need to proclaim the wondrous love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Friday is the **feast of** the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Referred in shorthand as the 'Magnificat', from th first part of her response to Elizabeth, Mary's



words of praise are repeated every evening by Catholics around the world: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord...".

Though titled after Mary, this feast day sees three saints witnessing to the glory of God and His providential love (Mary, Elizabeth, and John). May we join them and sharing the good news of God's work in our lives.
