

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Savior!

Today's gospel is distinct from the parable of the sower: rather than emphasizing our agency (important as it is!), Jesus highlights how all of our work is ultimate rooted in God's plan and power. He, not us, is behind all fruitfulness.

As followers of Christ, we have been entrusted with a privileged role in the Lord's work, what a relief it is to know that it doesn't depend

on us! We do our part and the Lord does the rest, in ways beyond our knowledge or understanding. In fulfilling our vocation - or even in the simple day-to-day tasks of life we often see how our small effort produced results beyond our imagination! Ours is simple to plant and trust.

May we never doubt that the Lord blesses even the humblest of offerings - and may we continue to faithfully do His work even when we don't see the results we might desire! In His own time, the Lord brings about great and surprising results - a harvest of grace. Cf. Ps 27 (26): 7, 9

This Saturday, June 22 is the memorial of Saint Thomas More (right) and Saint John Fisher (below). More was a married man, Fisher a bishop both were known for standing in opposition to King Henry's



divorce, refusing to sign an oath of supremacy (the king's claim as the supreme head of the Church in England, even over the pope).



Despite never inciting rebellion or revolution, they were convicted of treason and executed for holding fast to their faith. Saints More and Fisher, pray for us!

This week the priests of the archdiocese will gather with Archbishop Etienne and his auxiliary bishops in Ocean Shores for the annual priest convocation 'Priest Days'. We will celebrate daily Mass together, hear a variety of talks, celebrate our jubilarians, and enjoy a week of fraternity as brother priests.
