It was during the pandemic, after the long months of streaming-only Masses, confessions with communion in the back of the church, and many (so many!) emails, letters, and phone calls to try to connect & re-connect with each other. At long last, after painting circles marking proper distancing, gathering volunteers to check people in, and a million other confounding logistics, we had our first in-person Mass together outdoors behind the school. There was no music, the wind kept knocking my portable altar around, and folks were arrayed across the asphalt in a variety of lawn chairs. And despite all the crazy, it was *glorious*. People spontaneously hugged each other, eagerly participated in the prayers & responses, and many even wept as they came forward to receive communion. Afterwards, everyone lingered to catch up and enjoy the pleasure of being re-united physically and spiritually. It was not only a highlight in a difficult time, but a testimony to the character of Saint Mark's community.

Words can not adequately convey how great a privilege it has been to be your pastor and to have been allowed to share in the sorrows, joys, struggles, and triumphs of your lives over these last several years. I am humbled at the place you have made for me in your lives and so very grateful: thank you for making me a member of your family.

Though there are many questions yet to be discovered, explored, and answered in *Partners in the Gospel*, one is certain: the Lord is in our midst and doing great things with & for us - and He has amazing things yet in store! I know Father Ross and Father Davis will be blessed to be your priests - and they will bring their own wonderful gifts to bless our parish family.
