₩JMJ ★ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; whom should I
dread? When those who do evil draw near, they stumble and fall.Cf. Ps 27 (26): 1-2

"But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an everlasting sin." (Mark 3:29)

Christians have long wondered about this line in scripture, questioning what it means to blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and what exactly constitutes an unforgiveable sin. It seems to me that Jesus is not so much establishing any act as beyond redemption as He is rebuking those who would say that He is



animated by Satan rather than the Holy Spirit!

We know that there is no such thing as an unforgiveable sin; the Lord is willing

Christ and the Good Thief, *Titian* to forgive any

sin of ours that we offer Him. And THAT is perhaps the key to forgiveness: our *offering* of our sins to Jesus! The only time forgiveness is impossible is when we don't *ask* for it.

(By the way, if you haven't heard, confessions are available at Saint Mark parish every Wednesday from 5-6 pm and every Saturday from 3-4:30 pm!)

In today's psalm we proclaimed that 'with the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption'. May we always turn to Him, asking for His mercy and opening ourselves to receive the salvation He has won for us. This Thursday, June 13 is the memorial of Saint Anthony of Padua. Unexpectedly thrust into preaching at an ordination, his homily so moved those present that he was



sent off for further studies and teaching so that he could teach other friars. He later went on to preach to heretics, a task he fulfilled so well that he was nicknamed 'the Hammer of Heretics'. He is often shown holding a book or a lily, emphasizing his learning and purity, respectively, as well as the infant Jesus. Saint Anthony of Padua, pray for us!

This Thursday, June 13 holds a special day in my heart - not only for being the feast day of Saint Anthony of Padua (my confirmation saint!), but for being the fifteenth anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood at the hands of Archbishop Alexander Brunett.

It is hard to believe that a decade and a half have passed since that day....though a little less hard when I compare the face in the mirror to the man in the photo below! In any case, it is a joy to be a priest and a gift to be able to serve Catholics here in the archdiocese of Seattle.

Please pray for me and for all the priests who celebrate their anniversaries!
