


Would you be interested to recite one or more "Hail Mary" prayers in your native language?

The World Mission Rosary was created by Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen in 1951. This rosary honors the work of the missions, conversions and world peace with special emphasis on each of the Earth's regions, where prayers are needed. Its uniqueness is in the five colors represented in each of the decades which calls to mind an area where the Church continues her evangelizing mission.



Colors & Regions of the Mission Rosary

- Asia/Middle East: where the sun comes up and civilization began
- Oceania/Australia: for the ocean surrounding the Islands of the Pacific
- **Europe:** for the home of the Pope, clothed in white, shepherd of the world and his call for new evangelization
- The Americas (North & South America): for the fire of faith that brought missionaries to the Americas
- Africa: for its forests and grasslands

Archbishop Sheen said praying this Rosary, would "aid the Holy Father and His Society for the Propagation of the Faith by supplying Him with practical support, as well as prayers, for the poor mission territories of the world. When the World Mission Rosary is completed, one has embraced all continents and all people in prayer. You have given the world a great big hug! What a great gift to give your brothers and sisters in the missions!"

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

he Catholic Church teaches the fundamental importance of paying workers a living wage that allows them to meet their basic needs. Cooperative businesses are co-owned by the employees, which gives workers greater say in how the business is run, including the wages and salaries that workers earn. Those principles animate the work of the organizations creating opportunities and fighting poverty with support from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).


Seed Commons is a New York City-based national network of community loan funds that make cooperative businesses easier to start and less expensive than obtaining bank loans. Based on a "nonextractive" model, Seed Commons does not require borrowers to make payments on interest or principal until they can cover operating expenses, including market-rate salaries. With support from CCHD, Seed Commons helps workers become

cooperative owners who earn living wages at companies like a Chicago-based window manufacturer, which pays \$2/hour more than it did before it became a cooperative. The employee-owners now earn not only higher wages but profit-sharing checks as well.


Your support of CCHD helps workers become worker-owners who earn living wages and establish economic roots in communities that badly need greater employment and earning opportunities. When you give to the CCHD collection, you help not only national networks like Seed Commons but also organizations working to end poverty within your diocese, where 25% of your contribution stays to create opportunities in your own neighborhood.
