

Performs preventative maintenance to buildings and grounds to minimize plumbing, mechanical, electrical, lighting and heating system (boilers) failures. Maintains an inventory of cleaning supplies, restroom supplies and equipment

OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. a process that helps adults become members of the Catholic Church. The OCIA process is a spiritual journey of conversion that includes: Learning about the Catholic Church's beliefs, life, liturgy, and apostolic work Receiving the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist Developing a deep relationship with Jesus and the Catholic Church Experiencing the parish community Committing to the Catholic Church's liturgical and moral life

The OCIA process is not a sign-up to become Catholic, but rather a time of spiritual formation without obligation. It is open to:

Non-Catholics who want to learn more about the Catholic faith People who want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism or Profession of Faith Catholics who were baptized as infants but never received religious education, Confirmation, or First Eucharist
