FASTING AND ABSTINENCE GUIDELINES

Ash Wednesday (March 5th) and Good Friday (April 18th) are days of fast and abstinence.

Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

- Catholics age 14+ practice abstinence, which means no meat allowed on days of abstinence.
- Catholics age 18-59 practice fasting. On a fast day, one full meal and two small meals that do not equal one full meal.
