# Frequently asked questions about funerals

## How much do funerals cost?

One of the corporal works of mercy is burial of the dead – as such, we take seriously the responsibility and privilege of celebrating funeral rites for those who need them. At our parish there are only **a few required fees**, along with several typical stipends. These allow our volunteers, ministers and the parish to continue in their work, alleviate costs and express support for the effort offered:

# Required costs (checks should be made out to the individuals)

- Organist fee, \$175
- **Cantor fee**, \$175
- **Visiting clergy** stipend, \$200 (only if inviting guest clergy)

## Suggested donations (customary)

- **Parish** stipend\*, \$200-\$500 (*customary*)
  - We wish to emphasize the *voluntary nature* of giving a stipend to the parish. Give as you are able and called, confident of our gratitude!
- **Priest** stipend\*, \$\_\_\_\_\_ (customary)

\*Please note: donations are made out to Saint Mark parish, not the priest

- **Altar server** stipend, \$5-10 (*customary*)

### Can a family member or friend read or sing at Mass?

We have trained lectors and cantors for all of our liturgies. This assures that the liturgy & prayer is properly provided for and that the family & friends may focus on being ministered to rather than themselves ministering to others. Exceptions are rare and must be individually approved by the pastor in advance.

### Can a eulogy be offered at the funeral?

Though the Church allows for a member or friend of the family to speak in remembrance before the final commendation, we instead invite friends & family to speak at the reception or graveside, if desired. (Fr. Ross may allowed a <u>single person</u> to give a short, prepared, rehearsed eulogy (under 5 minutes) from the ambo <u>prior to</u> the start of Mass – but this should be discussed/arranged with him in advance).
